### Overall purpose of the job

This is an exciting opportunity for an entry-level candidate seeking to launch their career in environmental conservation, from within a leading environmental charity, delivering ambitious ecological schemes along Britian's longest river.

The role will provide hands-on support to the middle division of our Operations Team, bolstering resources and enabling us to scale up our exciting portfolio of environmental programmes in the river Teme catchment (specifically in the Upper Teme), an important tributary of the Severn.

You will provide end-to-end support to our farm advice and ecological restoration programmes in the region. Day-to-day activities will include landowner engagement, supporting in the planning and coordination of farm cluster events and practical assistance with planning and delivering a range of habitat creation and restoration initiatives.



The Severn is the longest river in the United Kingdom, stretching 220 miles from its source in the Cambrian Mountains in Powys Wales, through the counties of Shropshire, Worcestershire and into Gloucestershire to the iconic estuary. The culture and economies of the historic settlements across the catchment have been intertwined with the river through commercial navigation, fishing, water supply, and trade. Today, the Severn's rivers, including important tributaries such as the Teme, the Stour and the Warwickshire Avon, continue to play an essential role in supporting wildlife, wellbeing and economies of the region.



Our freshwater environments are in trouble like never before. The pressures are seemingly endless – sewage pollution, agricultural run-off, habitat loss and major weather events including drought and flooding are all threatening irreversible destruction of our freshwater ecosystems.

Despite the enormity of the challenge, it's not too late.

- Restoring and creating habitat mosaics at a catchment scale including; wetlands, riparian woodlands and floodplain meadows.


### • Empowering our communities

# Role Purpose



### Project delivery support

- Support in the organisation and delivery of farm cluster meetings and demonstration days to promote land use change in the Upper Teme catchment
- Provide day-to-day practical support in the preparation and delivery of environmental programmes by undertaking the following activities: preparation of external service contracts, contractor engagement, procurement of materials and equipment and on-site practical delivery.
- Assist with ground truthing exercises e.g. desk-based studies and modelling to appraise the optimum location for our interventions
- Support with landowner engagement through farm visits to identify opportunities and secure landowner support for our work.
- Shadow colleagues when delivering professional advice to landowners on a range of environmental priorities.
- Shadow colleagues whilst identifying the best delivery mechanism for each project, (i.e. ascertain whether the landowner, volunteers or external contractors will deliver the intended work)
- In time, lead on assigned project tasks, such as the end-to-end oversight of a particular capital works scheme, where you will be responsible for all aspects of the project, from landowner engagement, to finance management, to contractor management.
- Effectively manage and prioritise own workload to ensure project deliverables are met within the project timeframes.

### **Other Duties:**

- In addition to the above you will play a key role in the Severn Rivers Trust team helping to deliver our strategic objectives.
- Prioritise health and safety and wellbeing. Take responsibility for yourself, as well as the needs of others (e.g. participants, volunteers and colleagues).
- Support in establishing a workplace culture where staff are motivated to come to work, capable of performing to their highest standard and comfortable being themselves.
